Dear Friends;

I have good news to share, we are re-opening our church building for Sunday Worship Services in October!!! October 4 th will be our first Sunday. It will be so wonderful to gather together in person again. Of course like with everywhere else, there will be adjustments to maintain a healthy safe distance from other worshippers in accordance with the regulations of the Niagara Region, and provincial restrictions that allow for only 1/3 of the sanctuary capacity to be used. Please carefully read the following so that you will know what to expect as we gather.

First off, our church is considered a public building and so masks will be required. If you are unable to wear a mask for medical reasons, we would ask that you continue to worship with us online from home. Your health is our main concern.

Everyone will enter from the sanctuary doors, and after disinfecting hands, will be seated by an Usher, filling up every third pew from the front to the back. When the service is finished, Folks will leave the Sanctuary through the Fellowship Hall door, with the front pews leaving first. There will be no coffee time following the service for the next while.

All hymn books, envelopes and Bibles will be removed from the pews, and all songs and readings will be on the screens. The offering plate will be located at the entrance to the sanctuary and not passed through the pews. Due to the extra precautions we have taken we will be able to sing, and under Val's guidance we have added new members to the music leadership team. So, get ready for some exciting new experiences.

On a personal note I want to thank everyone who has chipped in and made the last few months of quarantine worship, not just possible but interesting and engaging. It was a steep learning curve and a LOT of work, but amazing things can happen when the "Body of Christ" pulls together.

It has been 24 weeks since our church had to suspend services because of COVID-19 and along with that suspension has come some challenges in so far as finances for the church are concerned. Donations are often made when the collection plate is passed around on Sunday morning and through our various fund-raising activities. With regular services and fund raising suspended, giving through those avenues are down substantially, although being able to make donations on-line through the CanadaHelps website has helped to offset this somewhat.

We have also been able to access some assistance through CEWS (Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy), one of the funding program the federal government put in place to assist with salary costs when companies including non-profit groups such as ourselves, experienced income reductions because of the COVID-19 closings. CEWS along with our Treasurer filing earlier than normal for prior year HST/GST Rebates and drawing down funds held in the UCC Foundation have all helped our cash flow position.

In short, we are keeping our heads above water and will be able to fund the added costs related to reopening in October, but that being said we can always use more help. If you haven't already done so, now might be a good time to contact Linda Gorham and have your giving switched to PAR or drop off or mail a cheque to the church, our Treasurer is still making deposits. Stay healthy, stay safe and we look forward to seeing many of you back in church when we are finally able to reopen.



Time To Get Creative Again!

September is quickly approaching and that means Creative Spirit will be starting up again - WOOHOO!

Creative Spirit will remain online until we see how COVID-19 and 'back to school' progresses this fall. For Creative Spirit, it is not only about having a space where folks can be safely distanced from one another, but also about safely using materials, supplies etc. These are shared resources in our regular setting (sharing is still a no-no) and currently, it is not within the budget to purchase a full set of supplies for each and every individual in Creative Spirit.

As I would truly love to get back to using various other mediums for our next round of Zoom sessions, here is what I propose: The Creative Spirit Subscription Box. This is a subscription that you sign up for, just like a magazine subscription, but is a box of various goods that is delivered to you on a monthly or quarterly basis for a fee... yes a fee. You knew there would be a catch.

As I have yet to finalize the cost of the box, I'm expecting it to be between \$20-\$30 month. Perhaps closer to \$30 for the first couple of boxes as you get your basic supplies that we use, that don't have to be replenished as often (paint brushes, paint palette, paints, markers, watercolour pencils etc).

If you have all of the basics at home, as I know some of you do, then this might not be something that you are interested in, but for those that don't have most of the things that we commonly use at Creative Spirit, then this will allow us to enjoy some other art practices that we haven't done in months. More importantly though, is that the subscription box means that YOU don't have to go into the stores to purchase items yourself, keeping you safer and with less stress / anxiety of having to be out in multiple places shopping. I have attached a PDF of the supplies list, so that you can check your resources at home and let me know what you have.



For some, the cost may be of concern. I completely understand this. Creative Spirit was never meant to be an "admission fee" gathering. I will be looking into a sponsor-a-box to help with those costs. Any thoughts, ideas and concerns you may have, PLEASE let me know.

We, as the Embrace Centre community, will continue to make Creative Spirit a safe, prayerful, loving, fun, enriching, empowering, calming, soul filled spiritual practice, in whatever way we can.

How many times have you said to yourself, "if I were to do that again...." or "I'll have to remember the next time we are working with [this], that I want to try it this way."? Here's your chance! Our first few weeks of Creative Spirit will be spent with Watercolour.

Here's the list of supplies for our month of Watercolour:

- Watercolour paint that could be tubes, liquid or pans set of 12 colours is plenty! (or
- even watercolour pencils if you would prefer)
- Brushes any, ideally have one round size 6, 8 or 10
- Watercolour Paper ideally nothing less than 140lb (5-10 sheets 9x12)
- Cardstock white or light coloured letter size (8.5x11) (couple sheets)
- Paint palette the 6 well plastic ones we use in CS are fine
- Sharpie Marker Black (waterproof marker) fine & extra fine
- Toothbrush any
- Saran wrap
- Salt
- Paper towel / rag
- · Glass or jar for water
- Painters Tape
- Glue standard pva school or glue stick
- Suitable work surface flat, that is washable in case paint gets on it
- Scissors
- Various tree / plant leaves.... Don't need to worry about those right now (haha)


