Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ:

It was a fun project that we probably would not think to do under non-covid-lockdown times. Everyone was happy to help out, some faces you would have recognized, and some were friends from other parts of Canada or other parts of the world.



There was one person who declined to participate due to theological differences. He did not believe it was true that God loves everyone, but rather God only loves those who have repented of their sins and asked to be saved. Fair enough, I guess. I assured this individual that I respected his decision to not participate as I would not want someone to participate against their conscience, knowing that I would never participate if I had to say anything other than God loves everyone. The interaction however left me feeling very sad. Because I truly believe with all of my heart that there is no greater good news then God's love being for everyone.

And so, as I reflect back on that conversation, I can't help but be thankful for our church community that is inclusive and welcoming of all peoples. And I am also resolved to continue to preach the gospel boldly and widely, because "Divine Love" is the good news that people need to hear. There is already enough negativity and condemnation to be found in the world, so Churches need to be counter-cultural and proclaim the hope found in Jesus Christ.

Getting Schooled By COVID-19

As I write this short reflection for the newsletter, I am sitting at our dining room table, the sun is shining, the windows are all open and the fan is on at my back. Rev Cheryl is sitting across from me listening to a lecture online, in preparation for the 'residency' portion of her course, 'Gender, Violence and Reconciliation,' part of her Doctor of Ministry program at Northeastern Seminary in Rochester, NY.

I, too, have been doing quite a bit of prep work in advance of the first two classes of my own Doctor of Ministry program, you remember, the one I started this year. Yep, before the severity of the outbreak of the Corona virus was known, I had registered for the program at Acadia University in the beautiful Annapolis Valley of Nova Scotia. I had purchased my airline tickets, ready to fly to Halifax on June 1 st. Yeah, Rev Cheryl's 'residency' is also going to be online and virtual.

I am looking forward to those two weeks in June though. Week one I am doing a course on The Prophets, primarily, Amos, Hosea and Micah. And, week two I shift to thinking about The Holy Spirit and her role in the birth and life of the church.

We had our first online session, kind of an introduction and welcome to the program. All of us first year Doctor of Ministry students were there, gathered around our computer screens. One person's cat jumped up on her console. Another's son ran by, waving joyfully at the camera and saying hi to daddy's new 'friends.' it was good to know that we are all trying to navigate our spaces and the time demands and, to realize that life does indeed go on. It is difficult to maintain that work/school/family/socializing structure in our lives when, these days, it is all

happening not only in the same place but often on the same devices. Like us, our grandson Logan stays in contact with the East Coast kinfolk using Zoom. But, unlike us, Logan doesn't necessarily recognize that he can fully participate in Family Game Night but, not in session 3 of DMin 8353 when Dr. Noel is lecturing on The Holy Spirit and Church History.

Anyway, the next newsletter/update will be coming out around the end of June. All of our classes will be finished and the task of paper writing will have begun and I will let you know how it went. Wish me luck, and if you think about it ... maybe say a little prayer, (or ten) for us.

In Western Christianity, Lectio Divina (Latin for "Divine Reading") is a traditional monastic practice of scriptural reading, meditation and prayer intended to promote communion with God and to increase the knowledge of God's word. In the view of one commentator, it does not treat scripture as texts to be studied, but as the living word.

As restrictions around community gatherings are lifted, starting in August, join Rev Bill at The Embrace Centre on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 for a short time of prayer and community building using the format of Lectio Divina. If social gatherings are still not permitted then, we will try to begin this weekly gathering using Zoom.



Looking For Facemasks?




Val Spear is currently taking orders for non-medical facemasks. All proceeds from these sales will go back to the ministry of St. Johns Stevensville United Church.
