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





Our Need For Sabbath

As I write this article, September is a mere five days away and so, we are five days away from ending our 2025 month of Sabbath rest. The practice of sabbath, a time of intentional rest and re-creation is a gift, offered to all of creation by our God and Creator from the very beginning of time. Indeed, our creation story, recounted in the first chapter of The Book of Genesis concludes with God resting on the seventh day and setting an example while also giving both permission and encouragement to all creation to do likewise.

While preparing to write this article I came across this quote from Tom Roth, "Rest is an investment in the energy you will need to be effective tomorrow." We rest, not because there is no work to do but because we are tired and no longer working efficaciously. We know that there is much work to do and we have to be rested if we are going to be at our best. With rest comes revitalization. With rest comes rebirth. With rest comes inspiration and renewed commitment.

It is difficult stepping back, knowing that there is work that we could (should?) be doing. There is a story in Matthew's Gospel in which a woman anoints Jesus with costly perfume. Judas challenges her that the money could have been given to the poor to which Jesus responds, "The poor you will have with you always, but you will not always have me." During moments of sabbath, we are afforded the opportunity to sit in an intentional way with our God, to be nourished and nurtured, strengthened and equipped for the challenges that lay ahead.

When we honour Sabbath, we admit to God, to ourselves and to the world that we are human and that we need God's presence and support.

We are all familiar with the Ten Commandments that The Book of Exodus tells us Moses brought down from Mount Horeb. The Fourth Commandment instructs the believer to "Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy." We are enjoined to set time aside, it might be a particular day, it might be a season, to open ourselves to God's grace and to recognize our reliance on God in all things.

Annie Lamott once wrote, "When you rest, you catch your breath and it holds you up, like water wings." Reflecting on Lamott's observation I would amend it slightly. When you rest, you open yourself to being caught by the breath of God, (the ruach or Holy Spirit) and she holds you up as if on the wings of eagles. The Psalmist catches some of this sentiment in the 91 st Psalm.

I pray that this time of Sabbath has been life giving and soul renewing. I pray that you found opportunities to rest in God's countenance and to know God's loving presence. And I pray that you have been gifted with a spirit of discernment that you might know what God is calling you to in this next season as the work and ministry of our small church community begins to take form.

Standing On Holy Ground

In listening to Reverend Bill's sermon this morning [August 17th], coupled with a daily passage I read a few days ago, it brought to mind a couple of very important beliefs for me...

When I was growing up, we used to go to Portugal every 2-3 years, as that's where my parents were born. And every time we were there, we'd go to visit Fatima. For those of you unfamiliar with the story of Fatima, it's located in central mainland Portugal, where there were several apparitions from Mother Mary to 3 children in 1917. I won't get into all the details of what the children went through, but if interested, I highly recommend

reading the book 'Fatima, in Lucia's Own Words'. Lucia was the eldest of the 3 children. The site of the apparitions is considered one of the most famous shrines in the world, honouring the Virgin Mary, and the Holy Ground where she'd appeared.

When we'd be in Fatima, from the youngest age, I used to always be in awe, knowing I was walking on holy ground. I'd feel a deeper connection to my faith while there and I often felt sad leaving. I remember that I'd think that I couldn't wait to get back there, so I could once again 'stand on holy ground', in order to feel closer to Mother Mary, but also to God and to Jesus.

As I grew up into an adult and life got fuller & busier and the trips to Portugal became fewer & fewer, I'd often find myself striving to regain that deeper connection to my faith that I used to feel in Fatima. It was tough at first, but eventually I began to feel it in other ways... hearing my babies laugh, watching a sunset, being out on my paddleboard when the lake is like glass in the early morning.

But in hearing Reverend Bill's sermon this morning, it reminded me that I also feel that deeper connection when I respond to Jesus calling... when I know what Jesus would want me to do in a particular situation, and rather than form excuses in my own mind as to why I can't, I just do it. And it feels wonderful & amazing, and it feels right! It's what Jesus is calling upon me to do. And truly, aren't we all just spiritual beings journeying through life in a human form? Aren't we all spiritually connected?

To quote Melody Beattie in *Journey To The Heart*:

"When you look for holy ground, look down. That's where your spiritual experience takes place. Right where you're standing, wherever you are now".



Bequeathing Blessings: A Message From The Trustees

We gratefully remember Eileen Elizabeth Kennedy, who moved on into the loving arms of God in her 100th year, peacefully slipping away at midnight at Douglas Memorial Hospital in Fort Erie a year ago, with her funeral following at St. John's Stevensville United Church thereafter, and her final gift to the church being received recently and invested by the Trustees.
